S U P E R F I N E and second broadcloths, of the most fashionable colours, with suitable trimmings to match ditto, double milled drab cloths, German serges and faggathies, wilton cloths, rattinets and shalloons, durants and tammies, strip'd, plain and check'd camblets and camblettees, double and single worsted damasks, dorsettees and poplins, black bombazeens and crapes, brocaded Queen's stuffs, black serge denims cotton and India jeanets, black everlastings, black, blue, pink, crimson and cloth coloured half yard and half ell wide calimancoes and ruffels, chintses, cottons and calicoes of the newest and neatest patterns, curtain ditto, German and Scotch oznabrigs, white and brown Irish sheetings, yard wide and 7 - 8ths Irish linens, brown holland, brown and white Russia drilling, dowlas and Prince's linens, yard and 3-8ths, yard wide, 7-8ths, 3-4ths wide, 10 and 11 nails cotton checks, furniture ditto, dimities and draw-boys, Flanders ticks and bed-bunts.....
